Moline Public Library Electronic Services Available COVID19 Closing

While the Governor's Stay at Home order continues into May, the Moline Public Library remains closed accordingly. This is a great time to remember that many electronic services can still be accessed through Moline Public Library's web site at molinelibrary.com/econtent.

Content such as Overdrive (eBooks, eAudiobooks, and movies), Axis 360 (eBooks, eAudiobooks), Hoopla (eBooks, eAudiobooks, music, comics, and movies) and Tumblebooks (interactive eBooks for children) are easily accessible from our web site with your library card.

Many resources beyond what the library typically offers have also been added to the library's web site during the COVID19 pandemic. Resources such as Abdo (educational eBooks for Pre-K through grade 12), Storyline Online (children's books read by renowned actors), Audible (eAudiobooks for children's and teens), and World Book Online are available with no library card necessary.

"We know our community misses their library during times like these, but we want them to know they can still get access to quality content while staying at home," said Library Director Bryon Lear.

The Moline Public Library also continues to extend its WiFi signal into the parking lot for those that need an Internet connection while the building is physically closed. No library card is needed for access.

Those with material checked out should know that any items originally due between March 13 and April 30 now have a due date of June 26. Library cards with expiration dates in March, April and May have had their expiration date extended to July 1.

"We're anxious to re-open the Moline Public Library for services when conditions and guidelines allow. Until that time, we hope patrons will take advantage of our electronic contents," said Library Board President Susan Blackall.
